

Bill Would Repeal Cadillac Tax, Medical Devices Tax, and Providers Fee

On Dec. 17, 2019, the U.S. House of Representatives passed a short-term continuing spending resolution to prevent a government shutdown and continue funding through September 2020. If signed into law, the spending bill would repeal the following three largely unpopular taxes and fees under the Affordable Care Act:

- The Cadillac tax on high-cost group health coverage, beginning in 2020;
- The medical device excise tax, beginning in 2020; and
- The health insurance providers fee, beginning in 2021.

This bill would need to be passed by the Senate and signed into law by President Trump before taking effect.
